- Read your home reader every day.
 - After completing home readers, ask your child to retell the story to you in the order that the events occur. What happened to the characters in this story?

Encourage your child to become a confident and fluent reader. Children often enjoy technology so set up a recording device and let your child record themselves reading. This is a great way for them to hear what their reading sounds like.

Mathematics

This term, students will focus on:

- Identifying numbers up to 100 and explaining the value of each number
- Identifying chance problems as will happen, might happen, won't happen.
- Investigating calendars months of the year and days of the week
- Investigating length using direct comparison and measuring length using informal units
