Investigating author's language in a familiar narrative

Students will read 'The Twits' and examine and analyse the language features and techniques used by the author, Roald Dahl. They will create a new chapter for this narrative for an audience of their peers, including an illustration to add detail.

Examining humour in poetry

Students will read and listen to a range of humorous poems by different authors. They will identify structural features and poetic language devices used in humorous poetry. They will use this knowledge to innovate on and evaluate poetry, expressing a personal viewpoint using evidence from the poem to support their view.

Health and P.E.

Making Healthy Choices

Students identify strategies to keep healthy and improve their fitness. They explore the *Australian guide to healthy eating* and the five food groups. Students understand the importance of a balanced diet and how health messages influence food choices. They create meal plans that reflect health messages.

Criss Cross

Students practise and refine fundamental movement skills to perform long-rope, partner and individual skipping sequences. They examine the benefits of being healthy and physically active, and how they relate to skipping.

Humanities and Social Science

Australia before, during and after European settlement

Students will recognise the significance of events in bringing about change. They will explain how and why life changed in the past and identify aspects of the past that remained the same. Students will describe the experiences of people in the past. They will recognise the importance of laws in society. Students will describe factors that shape a person's identity and sense of belonging.
